



8.45 LEARNINGS FROM SUCCESSFUL PORTS IN LIQUID BULK by Sandra de Mey, Commercial director, North Sea Ports.

The cross-border port known as North Sea Port was founded on 1 January 2018 and is the result of a merger between the Dutch Zeeland Seaports (Vlissingen and Terneuzen) and the Flemish/Belgian port of Gent. Despite the strong competition from Antwerp and Rotterdam, North Sea Ports has been rewarded two years in a row as best tank storage port of the year by Tankstorage magazine. Liquid bulk accounts for some 29% of all goods transshipped from sea-going vessels.

Sandra de May will share what has make North Sea Port successful and how they have managed to merge three ports (of two different countries) & grow its traffic despite the outstanding competition in their area. An inspirational session for Port authorities and logistic stakeholders to learn on how to join forces to attract new businesses.


